

Coordinated School Health Co-op

Announcing an Administrative Support program through the Education Service Center Region 12

Description:

By joining the Coordinated School Health Co-op, health educators, physical educators, school nurses/healthcare providers, and any other school staff members that are authorized to teach related health and physical activity content or supply health functions to school districts will receive research-based training, technical assistance, informational updates, and networking opportunities.

Cost Options:

1. Members of the co-op will pay \$550 per position or \$500 per position if six (6) or more positions are purchased.

Workshops that co-op members will receive FREE unless specified

- Suicide Symposium (attend at REDUCED registration fee)
- Unlicensed Diabetic Care Refresher training for employees trained within the previous 12 months

Explanation:

If your district purchases one position, that district may send one person to any of the above sessions that we offer during the 2009-2010 academic year. Note: The person does not have to be the same employee.

For example, the unlicensed diabetic care assistants must receive yearly updates by attending a refresher course (1/2 day training). The district may send one person to a UDCA session FREE. NOTE: Several sessions will be offered in the fall which will allow you to spread out the people needing training at no cost to your district.

If a district has new personnel that need the full day training for unlicensed diabetic care assistant, the district will be able to send another person to that training FREE since these are two different workshops.

Some districts use different school personnel, other than the school nurse to assist with screening hearing, vision and scoliosis screenings, thus these trainings may be attended by different district personnel.
